Thanks to Laxton's Good Samaritan

The following report was circulated by Nottinghamshire Police following some unpleasant goings on in Laxton last month:

Officers have launched an investigation after a good Samaritan interrupted the theft of plant machinery.

A man had spotted a telehandler being driven off from a property on Town End in Laxton, Nottinghamshire after he was woken by the commotion. (Local sources say he was setting off for work!) Becoming suspicious, (as the driver wasn't the owner) he followed the vehicle through Laxton and Egmanton before the two men inside abandoned the equipment and reportedly fled the scene in a car.

Officers were then called and have since been working hard to conduct enquiries and investigate the incident, which happened just after 5am on Friday (21 January 2022).

Inspector Charlotte Allardice, District Commander for Newark and Sherwood, said: "As a largely rural area with lots of our residents working in agriculture, we understand how deeply they are affected when this all-important equipment is taken from them. Not only does this leave them with a financial loss, but as this type of equipment is essential for their agricultural businesses it has a wider impact on their functions and their livelihoods."

"This is why we are absolutely committed to working with our residents and acting on local information in order to stop these incidents from happening. We would urge anyone with information about machinery theft, or any other crime, to speak to the local neighbourhood policing team. We are there and working proactively to serve the community and listen to concerns."

"Thankfully the equipment has now been returned to its rightful owner and the efforts of the good Samaritan to monitor the vehicle and report this to us are much appreciated."

Anyone who witnessed this incident, or has information or dash-cam footage, is urged to get in touch on 101, quoting incident 77 of 21 January 2022."

The Highway Code Has Been Updated

Changes to the Highway Code came into force on January 29th 2022. It introduces what is described as a 'new hierarchy of road users'. 10 sections have been updated and there are 50 new or updated rules.

The changes follow a public consultation on a review of The Highway Code to improve road safety for people walking, cycling and riding horses. It ran from July to October 2020, and received more than 20,000 responses from the public, businesses and other organisations. Most people who responded were in favour of all the changes.

Rules for all types of road users have been included in this update to improve the safety of people walking, cycling and riding horses.

The changes principally affect:

- introducing the new hierarchy of road users
- crossing the road at junctions
- walking, cycling or riding in shared spaces
- positioning in the road when cycling
- overtaking when driving or cycling
- cycling at junctions
- people cycling, riding horses and driving horse-drawn vehicles on roundabouts
- parking, charging and leaving vehicles



The publicity accompanying the launch of these new rules stresses that it is important that everyone understands their responsibility for the safety of other road users. It adds that many of the rules in the code are legal requirements, and if you disobey these rules you're committing a criminal offence. If you do not follow the other rules in the code, it can be used in evidence in court proceedings to establish liability.

The easiest way to find out what has changed is to use a browser to search for 'Highway Code Updates 2022'. You can read the full revised version free of charge online.

For £3.49 you can buy and download The Highway Code iOS app which will be updated this spring. An Android version is under development.

The updated Highway Code will be in bookshops from April 2022.

Stamps are Changing Too

Following a national trial, which has been declared successful, Royal Mail will now be adding unique barcodes to all their regular 'everyday' Definitive and Christmas stamps. The web site states that:

"Each barcoded stamp will have a digital twin and the two will be connected by the Royal Mail App. The unique barcodes will facilitate operational efficiencies, enable the introduction of added security features and pave the way for innovative services for our customers."

"Definitive stamps are the stamps that will be very familiar to most people. They feature the profile of HM The Queen. The barcodes match the stamp colour and sit alongside the main body of the stamp, separated by a simulated perforation line. The new barcode is an integral part of the stamp and must remain intact for the stamp to be valid."



"Non-barcoded stamps will be phased out but will remain usable until 31 January 2023. Customers are encouraged to use their non-barcoded stamps before this date. Alternatively, non-barcoded stamps can be exchanged for the new barcoded version using the Swap Out's scheme".

Royal Mail's 'Swap Out' scheme will open on 31 March 2022. Forms will be available via a variety of channels, including local Customer Service Points; the Royal Mail website and via their Customer Experience team. Customers will be able to use a Freepost address. Further details will be announced shortly and we will bring them to you via 'Open Field' as we become aware of them.



Wellow Needs Maypole Dancers

Wellow Maypole Celebrations 2022 are to be held on Saturday 4th June. Traditionally the dancers were from the village, but in recent years children from surrounding villages have been invited to join in.



After a gap of two

years, brought about by the pandemic, Wellow Maypole Celebrations will return in 2022. With the change in Bank Holiday arrangements to mark Queen Elizabeth's 70 years on the throne, Maypole Day will be celebrated on **Saturday 4th June** as part of the national extended Platinum Jubilee weekend. Our May Queen elect has been patiently waiting to be crowned since being chosen by ballot in 2019, but maypole dancers will of course also be needed for the big day!

Parents of boys and girls aged 3 years and upwards are very welcome to come along to one of our registration sessions to find out what is involved and sign up their children to take part. There are weekly dancing practices for approximately six weeks before the big day with a final rehearsal of the procession and crowning a couple of days before Maypole Day. Children must be aged at least 5 years to take part in this aspect of Maypole Day.

Come along to whichever suits best. Members of Wellow Maypole Committee will be present to explain all the details. Group Oil Order

Just prior to the last order the price had plateaued. We secured a price of 58.75p/litre (61.68p inc VAT @5%) on 20th February. That day Boilerjuice quoted an England average 1000 litre price of 62.58p. The last minute addition of two orders following initial discussions with the suppliers resulted in a reduction for everyone of almost 0.5p/litre, which adds up when you are buying in bulk.

Soon afterwards the price went up rapidly, reaching 68.5p on February 8th before falling slightly to 65.72p at the time of writing.

Subject to the weather and the needs of members, there may well be a late March / early April order. Please let me know if you are getting low. If you are, so may others be.

If you don't want to miss the chance to get a discount by ordering with a substantial number of others, please notify your current contact details and delivery instructions such as lock, need advance notice of delivery etc. I pass your land line, mobile(s) and email address to the chosen supplier.

Chickens at Christmas

The following item was sent in for the Christmas edition, but unfortunately there was no room then. It is of historical interest as well, so we are publishing it now for interest.

The Newark Herald carried a weekly column in 1936 entitled 'Our Village Week by Week'. Billy Pike of the Old England Hotel at Sutton on Trent was the author. The December item in 1936 included:

From Buying the Christmas Poultry

Although you may be unaware of the fact, a considerable amount of time and travelling is involved, before the poultry dealers deliver your Christmas dinner to the door.

The weeks prior to Christmas are anxious and worrying times for the farmer and poultryman alike. Last week I motorcycled round suppliers to check the quantity and quality of their stock. Laxton has always been prolific poultry country and it was there that I decided to venture. After buying a goodly quantity of chickens and geese, I suddenly realised it was getting dark and that my visitations among farmer friends must come to an end. Putting on my light switch, I realised to my dismay that it was Thursday, the day I was to have my accumulator charged, and that I was without lights on my machine. It was an hour after lighting-up time and there were several miles between myself and home. There were two alternatives - one to push the machine home, the other to ride and risk the consequences. Which do you think I chose? ...

N Vaccination Update

Children aged 5 -11 who are in a clinical risk group, or who live with someone who is in immunosuppressed, are being offered a Covid-19 vaccination.



Eligible children include those with diabetes, immunosuppression, learning disabilities, and other specified conditions. They will be offered 1/3 of the dose of the Pfizer Covid-19 vaccine given to older children and adults. The vaccine has been tested to make sure it is safe and each child needs 2 injections, usually 8 weeks apart. The local NHS is contacting parents and guardians by letter which will describe how to book an appointment. News at the time of writing suggests all 5 - 11s will be offered non urgent vaccinations from April.
